Vice President John Olson called October 6, 2018 meeting to order. 28 members and guests introduced themselves.

The Minutes of the September meeting were approved.

The treasurer reported a balance of \$1056.71 (includes \$734.00 from classes

The current classes should bring in another \$500.00 + dues

Expenses – Anchor Seal - \$285.00

Bottle Stoppers - \$80.00

Committee reports and Old Business

Membership – 48 members have paid the 2018-19 dues

<u>Library</u> – Current library coordinator would like to find someone else for the library

<u>Community Ed</u> – John Weaver reported that a few classes did not fill. The committee will discuss any changes that should be made. John reported that the class mentors were "great". It was suggested that we try to get pictures of each Community Ed. Class.

<u>Equipment</u> - there was some discussion about selling the large Jet and replacing it with 2 new lathes, perhaps the small Delta. It was suggested by the VP that the committee should decide by the November meeting.

Also discussed under equipment was the need for another chuck, larger bowl gauges and perhaps skew chisels. Several members expressed that we perhaps should not put those in a student's hand

Another ½" Bowl gauge is needed (have 8 now)

The Equipment committee will consider all suggestions and make recommendations as necessary.

New Business

Need to confirm that we can keep equipment at the school. Royce will do that.

It was suggested that we have more "hands on" for the members at a meeting (at least every other month or every 3rd month)

Bulk Purchase committee – motion passed to put bulk purchases into minutes

Library budget – Sue made a motion to research adding some current magazines, etc. to library. Motion was tabled to the November meeting.

John reported that the Brandon School has asked to have some assistance and recommendations on lathe purchase. It was moved and passed to have help from our cub members to go to Brandon to assist the shop teacher.
