November Meeting Minutes...

President Royce Meritt called November 10, 2018 meeting to order. Members and guests introduced themselves.

The Minutes of the October meeting were approved.

The treasurer reported a balance of \$1955.00

*A proposed budget was handed out

It was reported that our 501C7 certificate has been received. As a non-profit organization 35% of gross receipts is tax deductible. It is estimated this would be about \$1400.00

Committee reports and Old Business

Membership – 2019 dues are being collected. Name badges can be obtained by contacting Royce.

<u>Library</u> – No report. Members are encouraged to request specific items (videos, books, etc) that you would like to see added to the library. There is \$200.00 allocated to library purchases and we would like to use it for items you want. It was recommended that we not include magazine subscriptions in our library. It has been recommended to add the John Lucas book "The Beaded Bowl"

<u>Community Ed</u> – John Weaver reported that classes went great and will resume during the spring semester. It was recommended that 2 lathes be available to new club members at no charge during the classes.

<u>Equipment</u> – Chair of the equipment committee, Doug Noteboom recommended that the club retain the big lathe at the Harrisburg school, attach lights and use it for club demos. He also recommended that the club purchase 2 new Delta lathes (available at Lowe's, Home Depot and others) for approximately \$1500 for the two.

Doug's committee is also recommending that the club sell the old Jet that is not variable speed for approximately \$150.00 at that price until the January meeting.

It was also recommended that the club purchase tools and equipment as needed for any new lathes. (The club has 8-outfitted toolboxes)

A motion was made, discussed and seconded to purchase 2 lathes and accessories to a maximum of \$1650. Motion passed by majority voice vote.
