Committee reports

• <u>Membership</u> – Corky has sent notice to those members that have not yet paid their dues for 2019. There are 39 members with 12 memberships outstanding.

- Community Ed John Weaver reported that classes have been going well. The 101 classes are very popular and next year will have 3-4 of the 101 and 3-4 of the project classes. There are currently 15 on the waiting list for 101 Classes Tues and Thursday of next week are full and will be the last week of classes. It has been recommended to develop a process to cancel classes without a minimum of participants. Instructors and mentors need to be signed up before submitting a class to community Ed.
