One of my favorite sites to visit is World of Woodturners. The text below is from their site and tells how to join (in red). Completely free and some wonderful projects shared. As I recall there was a prompt response from the administrator after my email requesting access. I have been using this site daily for probably five years. Highly recommended. Search for World of Woodturners for a preview.

The World of Woodturners site (WoW) originated in November, 2001. At its start it was the only interactive site where woodturners could post photos and descriptions of their work and engage in discussion about their art. WoW members think of themselves as a family. They are artists who have become friends and

who willingly share their talents and skills. This is a place where the novice freely mixes with the seasoned professional in an atmosphere of shared respect. No one is anonymous and everyone uses their own name. From this venue has arisen some incredible art, some of which can be seen in the public gallery. Enjoy this display of fine work. Access to the site itself is at no cost, by obtaining a membership invitation from an existing WoW family member or **Contacting site administration at wowadmin@shaw.ca**. Include your name and a brief description of your woodturning experience in the message.
