June 5th, 2021 Meeting Minutes

The June meeting at Harrisburg High School was called to order at 1:03 by President Jeff Albrecht. There were 34 turners attending. Introductions were made.

Minutes of last meeting: May minutes were approved as presented.

<u>Treasurer's report</u>: Jack reported that there is approximately \$2300 in the treasury. All funds from the Community Education classes have been deposited.

Education Committee report: John W thanked everyone that helped with the Community Education Spring classes. McCrossan boys attended three pen turning classes and were very appreciative of the Club's time and instruction for them. Classes for Fall are being planned and will again be held at McCrossan Boys Ranch (building 8). We will need to secure tools in the trailer when classes are not in session per McCrossan Ranch policy. A key to the shop building will be provided for our use, once again. Fall classes will include four Woodturning 101 classes, a Duck Call class, a Natural Edge Bowl class, a Kitchen Gadgets class (pizza cutter, ice cream scoop, honey dipper, rolling pin, etc.), and an Office Gadgets class (pens, letter opener, magnifying glass, smartphone holder). We hope to begin on September 14 and end on October 7, meeting on each Tuesday and Thursday (this would give us a four-week period with no holidays). John will work on plans for scheduling of class mentors so we have enough for each class (but not have people driving unnecessarily when slots are filled). Also, there may be classes/turning time available on Saturdays for Club members at the Ranch during the Sept 14-Oct 7 timeframe. More to come on this.




