September 9th, 2021 Meeting Minutes

The September meeting was held at McCrossan Boys Ranch Shop and was called to order at 7:00 PM by President Jeff Albrecht. There were 20 turners attending. We extend our sincere sympathy to Al Hird and his family for the passing of his mother.

Minutes of last meeting: August minutes were approved as presented.

Treasurer's report: Jack reported that there is approximately \$2400 in the treasury.

Education Committee report: Lathes were unloaded prior to the meeting and placed in the shop. Tool boxes will be stored in the trailer and brought in when classes are in session. John W and Al will be at the shop one hour before classes start to be certain tools are sharpened. Sign-up sheets were available for mentor/instructor sign-up. Many had used Sign-Up Genius to fill some of the slots. John does not know how

many students have registered at this time—online booklet has only recently been made available to the public.

Membership Committee report: Dues for 2022 may be paid starting in October.

Equipment/Purchasing Committee report: Doug described an adjustable lathe stand that would allow a seated person to turn (for someone in a wheelchair). Cost would be \$800-900. Motion made and passed to purchase an adjustable lathe stand.

<u>Library report:</u> We will be adding a DVD from the SWAT Symposium (has all the classes from that event). Besides turning, there were classes on liming, coloring and even carving.

Technology Committee report: No new information at this time.

Old Business:

- The SWAT Symposium in Waco TX was a great time for those who attended. Classes, food, fellowship was wonderful.
- Jeff, John O, John W and Doug plan on being at the Downtown Sioux Falls Art Festival on September 11th.
- Email will be sent out describing As Wood Turns challenge Clubs submit photos of turned ornaments and the Club with the most submissions wins an online demonstration by Alan Stratton.

New Business:

- Bill has a request for 100 military pens for vets at the VA this would be done for 2021 Christmas gifts. We believe that we currently have enough finished pens to fill this request. Doug suggested that we plan for a December pen assembly day so we can replenish inventory (perhaps send supplies home with members in October and November so they can turn barrels before assembly day).


