#### <u>Siouxland Woodturners</u> Board of Directors Meeting

November 6th, 2021 Meeting Minutes

A November 6<sup>th</sup> meeting of the SLWT's Board of Directors was called to order at 12:05 PM by President Jeff Albrecht.

Club officers and Committee Chairs present were: Jeff Albrecht - President Jim Collinwood – Vice-president Jack Zimmel - Treasurer Bonnie Lynch – Secretary John Weaver – Education Chair Doug Noteboom – Equipment/Purchasing Chair Jeff Westwick – Prize/Raffle Chair Corky Miles – Membership Chair Gene Wubben – Technology Chair John Suhreptz – Newsletter

A discussion of the future of Community Education classes was held. In general, classes work quite well, but we still need better commitment by members in assuming instructor roles. The income from these classes keeps the Club viable and allows us to purchase needed equipment and make improvements to Club technology.

Topics discussed were:

- Setting class schedule for Spring
  - Dates selected for 2022 are: April 19, 21, 26, 28, May 3, 5, 10, 12.
- Including instructor name in Community Ed catalog
  - Will do, when instructor is known
- Class preparation: tool sharpening, lathe clean-up (rust on lathe beds due to storage in trailer)
  - Will work on better preparation/assigning duties (have group/committee, maybe)
  - o adding desiccant to trailer
- List of instructors
  - Will encourage members at general meeting and pass around sign-up
  - Know who can fill in, if needed
- Job description(s) might be helpful (set-up/sharpening/instructors/mentors)
- Members encouraged to take class (if not full) for cost of materials
- On-line sign-up worked well—should continue to use
- Need for additional equipment
  - Eight stations currently (adequate)—lathe, toolbox, safety gear
  - May need larger cargo trailer (discuss at general meeting)
  - Upgrade video equipment (discuss at general meeting)

John W is stepping down as chair for 2022.Doug volunteered to take this position. He hopes to get assistance from Michelle.

November General Meeting Minutes...

November 6th, 2021 Meeting Minutes

The November meeting was called to order at 1:03 PM by President Jeff Albrecht. There were 23 turners attending. We extend our well wishes to Ranah for a speedy recovery. <u>Minutes of last meeting</u>: October minutes were approved as presented.

**Treasurer's report**: Jack reported that there is \$3336.85 in the treasury. The last funds from Community Education classes have been deposited (\$1316.50). The new lathe stand has been paid for (not received yet).

**Education Committee report**: John explained how Community Ed sets class prices and what we make for teaching: we tell them what our materials costs will be for each student and then they set a price; 50% of the funds above materials costs is given back to our Club. For example: kit & materials cost = \$12, class fee = \$50, difference = \$38; therefore, SLWT "earns" \$19 per student for providing instruction and equipment. John is stepping down as chair and Doug has agreed to replace him (with assistance from Michelle). It was agreed to go forward with Spring 2022 classes to begin after Easter. They will be held on April 19, 21, 26, 28 and May 3, 5, 10, 12 (all Tuesdays and Thursdays). Doug passed around a sign-up sheet for instructors.

**Membership Committee report**: Dues for 2022 are \$25 and may be paid now. Corky reported that 21 have paid to date.

**Equipment/Purchasing Committee report**: Doug reported that the lathe stand we ordered is being shipped. We would like to keep two of our eight lathes (one small one and our big one, w/toolboxes) here at the school shop so they can be used during meetings. We would like to upgrade the Club's current trailer. Let Doug know if you find a 12'-14' tandem axle cargo trailer that is for sale, reasonably priced. Doug has consolidated all materials for the "Pens for the Military" project into one large tote. Bill has agreed to take care of this project/materials as a part of his responsibilities as the new chair for this committee.

#### Library report: No report.

**Technology Committee report**: Gene explained upgrade options for the Club's technology. It would be nice to have two cameras to capture demonstrations/meetings (picture in picture view). A new computer and additional camera would be ideal, as well as a locking box for the

equipment. Motion made and passed to spend up to \$1200 on upgrading our Club equipment. Gene would also welcome another technology person to help with Club activities.

- Jack has a Craftsman lathe w/duplicator--\$200.






# Community Ed Classes...


The spring sessions of the Comm Ed classes have been set. There will be eight classes in April and May 2022. More information in the next newsletter.







































# November Ring Demo by David Grant...
