<u>Membership</u>: Corky reported memberships can be paid to him. Royce is the contact for anyone still needing a club badge. Using magnets behind the badges was discussed. John made a motion that we should buy magnets to attach the badges and Corky seconded it. Mike Dimick volunteered to find and buy them. Motion passed by voice vote

Education Committee report

AAW update of officers. Gene has helped Royce find the place on the website. There is still discussion of the need for officers to be AAW members.

John Olson made a motion that we eliminate the mandated AAW membership requirement in our by-laws. Ron Prusa seconded the motion and club members voted by voice vote to accept the motion.

<u>Military Pens</u>- Bill reported that 80 pens were presented to the disabled at the VA hospital. They were very grateful for the gifts. A letter was presented by Bill McGinnis thanking our club for the work with the Military pens and those pens presented to the Veterans Christmas party. Bill reported that 60 pen kits are left and we need to order more. John Olson moved that we order 400 with 20 extra mechanisms. Corky Miles seconded the motion and club passed the motion by voice vote.


