Education Committee report

Please sign up on the computer program if you can mentor for a class. Lots of mentors are needed. Michele Bierstedt reported that the 101 classes are filled @ 8. There was discussion about providing instruction to those on the 'wait' list and several ideas were presented including having a 101 class at the April meeting. Michele will look into several possibilities including if we are in conflict with community ed. Michele will contact Melanie regarding that

question as well as exploring having 101 people as part of another class with individual instruction.

<u>Library-</u> Rex reported that several woodturners' magazines have been put in the library and the extra copies are available for members to take if they would like them. Doug said he has several English wood turners magazines. If you would like them, please contact Doug.

<u>Equipment-</u> The inventory of our tools will be done today. Tools will also be sharpened.

<u>Stan Houston</u> – A thank you was given to those that assisted with the Stan Houston show. It was suggested that next year we try to have projects that don't explode or create a lot of dust. If we are interested in having a professional come at that time in conjunction with Stan Houston we need to start working on it ASAP.

By-law revision

David read the current by-law update (not requiring AAW membership to be an officer).

The treasurer was asked to pay the AAW dues for Ranah as an honorary member of the club.

Note – club sponsored activities are covered by the AAW liability and that policy has been renewed and money sent to AAW.

<u>Military Pens</u>- Bill reported that we have 150 pens in inventory. A unit just came back and will require about 100 pens so more need to be ordered. There are packages of mechanisms available.

Ron suggested we have packages of mechanisms, etc available to take home for those wishing to make pens for the military at home. At the present time we have mechanisms but not casings. Rex said there are 5 mechanisms in the bags that he has purchased.
